## Garden Tip for January

Now is a good time for pruning! And not just for roses – hydrangeas, lavender, and other shrubs and trees can be pruned this time of year. There are many good sources online for guidance on pruning. Check out <a href="this article">this article</a> on pruning roses. Pruning not only relieves the plant of dead and spindly growth, it also prepares it for a healthy growing season. The important part of the timing is to complete the pruning before the last frost and the plant starts its new growth. And maybe it's time to invest in new pruning shears? Having good tools makes the work easier and more fun.
